SUMMARY

My primary research areas are in *ethics, social and political philosophy, and philosophy of economics*. My work concerns tensions between individual autonomy and the public good, issues of social cooperation and coordination, and democratic rights. My most recent focus is on the ethics of social media, the attention economy, and digital technologies, through the lens of attention and salience. I have a particular *interest and demonstrated excellence in teaching* for a wide range of courses at both undergraduate and graduate levels. I have recently developed a learning platform on the ethics of attention and digital technologies (www.attentionethics.com). I have served as Chair of my Department and sat on various ethics review boards. I am the co-PI and Principal Researcher on a research project that has been funded through the Norwegian Research Council.
